The weekend allowed the players the chance to meet with, and challenge opponents from different provinces. They shared experiences and advice and had great fun. A great step forward for Pickleball in South Africa!













Memel's 2nd Annual Recreational Tournament

The event in March combined the celebration of our SA Human Rights Day and the International Day of Sport for Development and Peace (in April).

"What we saw today melted our hearts. The kids from Memel Primary, players from Pretoria, Joburg, Durban, Zimbabwe, Bethlehem and the USA; all there to play and celebrate. (Singing the National Anthem saw some of us older folk become a little overcome.)

For perspective, in 2018, the local municipal tennis club allowed Memel. Global access to two of the three sadly neglected courts in 'town'. Memel. Global staff, including girls and women from the SheWinS project, refurbished the courts by hand. Donors from the US and South Africa helped to make this possible. And so began Pickleball Play in Memel, and the local primary school became the first to include Pickleball as a school sport.

The Memel Eagles team either work, or have worked, for Memel.Global. Today, seven fixed teams, competed in an exciting round robin. An exhibition battle between KZN and Free State followed. Less intense games were also played to include everyone. The sound of the ball strikes were mixed with shouts of encouragement, whoops of joy, playful banter and shrieks of laughter.

Going forward, The Eagles' children are becoming just as passionate about Pickleball, and practice whenever they can. Around Memel, the game has really taken off. Local fire fighters, "Working on Fire", and even a young retail worker, have taken up paddles and joined the Memel Eagles Team.

The obvious absence of age, race, gender or religious barriers, and the evident genuine mutual respect, cooperation and community spirit, are in no small way attributable to the sense of equality that is fostered when playing Pickleball. This game has changed the face of Memel. Lawyers, teachers, shopkeepers and other business people turned out to support the event. What Pickleball can do for Memel, it can surely do for every community in South Africa! "

This section is dedicated to sharing important news and decisions from the Interim National Executive Committee

The sub-committees are up and running.

The Competitions and Events sub-committee has proposed an age group segregation which was voted in by the Interim National Executive Committee. The age groups for Pickleball in South Africa are as follows:



- Juniors u/12, u/14, u/16, u/18
- Open (19 34 yrs)
- 35+ (35 49 yrs)
- 50+
- 60+
- 70+

The segregation will allow for a more focussed strategy and development plan to grow the game in a way that is best suited for each group.

PROVINCIAL ASSOCIATIONS

The process of establishing provincial associations remains ongoing. The process is expected to take a long time but we will publish updates as positive forward motion is achieved.

MEMBERSHIP

The membership process has been restructured to ensure more benefits to members and to simplify the process. The membership portal is expected to go live soon. PSA wishes to thank its prospective members for their patience and support in this regard.
